
• Buddy took liberties with phrasing and

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Professor Twang's E9 Grab Bag!

OK, where were we? Oh yah, cleaning up that ugly bunch of scrap metal we all call "The under carriage." My changer came apart on my ShoBud Professional very easily. The axle slid right out. Then I used a Dremel to grind a number on each finger bracket in the order I removed them. Couldn't use a marker because the cleaning solvent would remove it. *Remember*, organization is the key to getting this thing back together. I then soaked the filthy changer parts in a metal coffee can filled with naphtha. BTW, metal cans seem kind of hard to find. **Note:** I later learned to use lacquer thinner instead of naptha from Mike at Mullen. It woks much faster and does a nicer job. Keep it covered air tight. It evaporates fairly quickly. With either cleaner, exercise the following safety precautions.

- 1... Don't breathe the fumes (and of coarse, don't smoke, in fact, never smoke).
- 2... Be in a well ventilated area.
- 3... Wear gloves and safety glasses. Lacquer thinner will ruin your regular glasses!
- 4... Don't let the splash from this stuff get on anything you care about.
- **5...** While working in and out and around this stuff, have the coffee can on a thick bunch of news paper.

I use stiff little wire brushes to scrub my parts. I think they have brass bristles. One nice thing about solvents is the gunk and dirt all settles to the bottom. You can then pour out the cleaner top solvent into another can and discard the dirty stuff.

While scrubbing the parts, I have my air compressor blow gun handy and blow the parts dry and clean.

As for ugly old pull rods, I learned a trick from James Morehead on how to clean them up and make them look great. Mine looked gray and shabby. Wrap a rag around an electric drill handle and secure it in a vise. Not so tight it cracks. Your drill should have <u>variable speed and a trigger lock</u>. Chuck up one end of a dirty pull rod in the drill. Hold the other end in a gloved hand. **Note:** *I'm assuming the rod is straight*. Get some 400 and 600 sand paper handy. Also a piece of 000 steel wool. Get the rod spinning fairly fast and with your free hand, run the 400 sand paper up and down the length of the rod. Follow it with 600 and then the steel wool. The rod will look so much better. Don't take off more than necessary.

Sorry for lack of any illustrations. I'll have some neck time. So, "Keep on Steelin". RP

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
